To apply to become a Teaching Artist, please submit the following materials:

- Cover letter including your approach to teaching, your art form and/or the philosophy that informs your work
- Résumé demonstrating your experiences as an artist and/or as a teaching artist
- One-page outline of a one-session (45 minute-1 hour) art curriculum for K-5
- Outline of a two or three session art curriculum for K-5
- One current lesson plan that references the Oregon State Standards for K-5
- Examples of your own recent work
- Professional references
- Availability for teaching and travel within Marion, Polk and Yamhill counties
