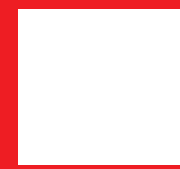

ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE OPPORTUNITIES

Many artists do not have a dedicated studio where they can create work, and even those that do sometimes need a change of scenery. That is where SAA's Artist-in-Residence program comes in. This free opportunity provides an artist (or artists) the chance to stretch their wings, and make new work. The Debra Smith Allis Studio, in the Annex at the Bush Barn Art Center, is open to artists of all disciplines. As part of SAA's Community Arts Education programming, there are also specific times of year dedicated to particular groups of underrepresented artists. Two deadlines are approaching for specific residencies: one for African American artists (January 15), and one for veterans (February 15). 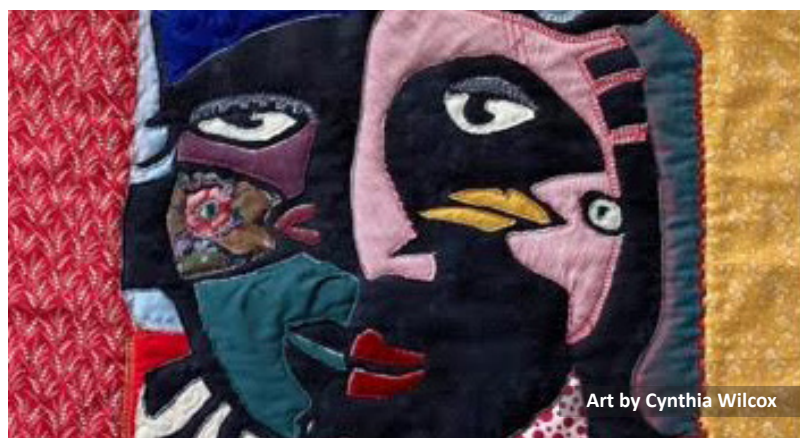
CREATIVITY OF VOLUNTEER GROUP FEATURED IN TWO PART EXHIBITION

Shortly after the A.N. Bush Gallery opened in the Bush Barn Art Center in 1964-1965, a group of 12 volunteers under the leadership of Nancy Gromsen attended the Portland Art Museum's docent seminar, 'How to be a Museum Guide'. Since that time, the Gallery Guides have played a pivotal role at the Salem Art Association. They greet visitors, sponsor tours, offer scholarships, and assist with educational programs for students.

Many of the members of the Gallery Guides are artists and have shown in exhibitions throughout Oregon. This exhibition gives these wonderful people an opportunity to show their work in the setting which they take care of on a daily basis. SAA is honored to be able to share this exhibition as a way of saying 'Thank You' to the group for all they do.

Part I of the exhibition runs January 15-February 2, with a reception from 5:30-7:30 pm on Friday, January 18. Part II will be on display February 5-23, with a reception from 10 am-Noon on Tuesday, February 5.

GRANTOR SPOTLIGHT

SAA is thrilled to have been awarded three grants from the City of Salem's 2018-2019 Transient Occupancy Tax fund. The three awards include:

- \$43,520 Facility Operating Grant for general operating expenses related to the Bush Barn Art Center and Annex
- \$10,000 Capital Improvement Grant to enhance the wall exhibition space in our galleries
- \$10,000 Special Event Grant for marketing the Salem Art Fair & Festival

As a cornerstone arts and culture organization for Salem and the mid-Willamette Valley, SAA annually serves over 70,000 people, providing a catalyst for community change while contributing to our region's creative economy, generating cultural tourism, building social relationships, promoting civic engagement, and improving the lives of children.

Funding from the City of Salem TOT funds has a significant impact in ensuring that SAA can continue to increase the cultural appeal of Salem and enhance the visitor experience.
