

Lafayette August 4th 1862

Dear Bush,

Enclosed you will find a com. in reference to the mail route from here to Salem. I have not time to write that speech out now. I have just received a letter from Nes. asking me to come up and defend a man by the name of Wimple who is arrested and under charge of murdering his wife in Polk Co last Sunday. It appears from his own story that he is a monomaniac, and naturally somewhat idiotic. That he was jealous of her that she shot at him with a revolver and the ball went through his shirt sleeve, that he in the heat of the moment caught the revolver and struck her over the head two or three times and killed her, then put the body under the floor, locked the door and set fire to the house, and fled to the hills where he was found on Tuesday by Nes and taken without resistance. I start immediately and will advise you further. Tell Charles to give me the facts of Pratts career from the time he left N York until his arrival in Oregon and do it soon---

Wimple is a man about forty and his wife was about sixteen years of age they have been married some three years
