The "Thicks" now talk of holding another convention for the purpose of disorganizing, and now sir as this is but the beginning of our struggle and a critical period in the political history of our county know nothingism will certainly do its utmost therefore you will do the party a great favor if you will furnish us with the Knownothing Ritual, during this campaign, or at least when they hold their disorganizing meeting which is whispered to be on the 3 day of May, we intend to vote it down if possible. If you send it you shall have it again at your request and time, if you cannot let it go anyhow send me a copy of their oath binding them selves to "support the political interests of " their own party above all others.
