

Portland OT July 14, 1856

Dear Bush

Yours of June 25th was received last Thursday--I asked Frank Goodwin about your bill and he is to make a report of his accounts to this court and he says that shall be included--I will ask him about it again in a day or two--you had better send down another copy of the bill Messrs Campbell and McErvan say that the bill against the Multnomah aint worth a d--n that Capt Hoyt says he has a bill of passage to affect that--I asked McNausee for the amount of his account and he says he will settle it this week--I told Lowmsdale that you had a note against him and if he had the money you would send it down-he says he hasn't the money-but if you would take scrip he thinks he might pay it-or he expects to get a judgement against Coffin et al and when he gets that and the money on it he can pay you like a d---n

Travaillet says that he paid you for two years and Boyd for one--(besides one for Dr Broy) which makes three years that are paid for and that you stopped his paper last Fall. That if you will make out the bill for the time that remains due he will pay it
D---n Eugene City! everyone will vote for Corvallis here-especially those that ever expect to have to go to the seat of government in --- advise active Gov Ben to dry this d---d war up, its getting more farcical every day. No news- I shall be up the latter part of this month.
