Dear Sir:

Mr. Pyle has written to you about the statements of Mr. Hutson, made by him by way of reply to the article in the democrat, I understand, but whether he mentioned that Mr. Hutson confirmed your statement of the contract made by Smith and Avery I know not. Mr. Hutson fully sustains your article on both the Malone affair and the Capitol question.
