### **Special Exhibitions:**

*Nancy Floyd: For the Love of Trees* in the Study Gallery and Print Study Center until June 21st.

Award-winning Bend, Oregon, photographer and author, Nancy Floyd, brings her work that was produced in the H.J. Andrews Experimental Forest near Blue River, Oregon and the Zena Forest outside Salem over the past two years. Her work explores the unique bond Oregonians have with the forest and trees, including those who study trees, those who protect trees, those who make a living off trees, and those who see trees as part of their daily life.

Come explore Hallie Ford Museum of Art's permanent exhibitions! The museum has galleries dedicated to the exhibition of works from the permanent collection. Contemporary and Modernist artwork by prominent Northwest artists is displayed in the Carl Hall Gallery. Customary art and contemporary fine art by Native American artists with ties to the Northwest can be seen in the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Gallery. Objects from the ancient world, Christian and Islamic art, and Asian, European and American art can be viewed in the Mark and Janeth Sponenburgh Gallery.
